Matthew 26:26-29, "While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body." ²⁷Then he took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. ²⁸This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. ²⁹I tell you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it anew with you in my Father's kingdom."

John 15:1-17

¹I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ²He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵I am the vine; you are the branches. Your testimony should be about 4-5 minutes long. Please do not go over the time limit, as it affects the audience's ability to listen to you and to those who come after you.

1. **I felt a need for having my sins forgiven and becoming a Christ-follower . . . [how/why]**
2. **[What/who] caused me to think about Jesus and my need for a forgiver and leader . . . (how did they cause me to do that?)**
3. **I know that when Jesus died on the Cross, He . . . (did what for me)**
4. **[When/how] did I ask Jesus to become my Forgiver/Leader and Savior?**

Sharing About Becoming a Christ Follower utilizing 3 Images

As you are thinking about baptism, here is an explanation of what we're asking you to present that day... Your testimony should be about 4-5 minutes long. Please do not go over the time limit, as it affects the audience's ability to listen to you and to those who come after you.

 - 1) **An image representing your life before you came to Christ...**
 - 2) **An image representing how you turned your life over to Christ and share a verse from the Bible that helps you to understand what that means...**

The point at which you surrendered to Jesus is the crisis point or turning point that we must all come to in order to trust Christ as our Savior. People need to hear you describe how that happened in your life.
 - 3) **An image representing what you desire for God to do with your life.**
 - These may be photos, paintings, poems, word pictures, pottery, stories, PowerPoint slides... actually anything creative!
- As part of your story read a Bible verse that encourages you as you live for Christ and explain how this verse helps you. Do not skip the Scripture part of your testimony!
- You may do this entirely on your own or solicit the help of anyone you wish provided that the images have their origin in your heart and your experience. The other people might be helpful in translating your internal image into an actual image that we can show to others. If the image is yours, it will communicate very clearly to others.

Instructions For The Day Of Your Baptism

Stuff you need to know and what to expect the day you're baptized:

1. Begin the service in the clothes you will be baptized in.
2. You may wear shorts or long pants. We suggest that you wear a t shirt or button up shirt, but be sure it is not white since white becomes see through when it gets wet.
3. We advise women to wear their swimsuits under their clothes.
4. Wear sandals or flip flops
5. Be sure to bring a change of clothes, which you will put in the bathroom where you will be changing. Do not leave any valuables unsupervised.
6. Bring two large towels. One to cover and dry off with immediately as you come out of the water and one to leave in the bathroom with your clothes.
7. Bring a gym bag or plastic bag to carry your wet clothes home in.
8. Bring a comb or brush for your hair.
9. When more than one person is being baptized, you will each share your testimony one after the other as a group, and then we will baptize you one after another.
10. Your testimony should be about 4-5 minutes long. Please do not go over the time limit, as it affects the audience's ability to listen to you and to those who come after you.
11. Parents will participate in their child's baptism
12. Small groups will stand up front with their group members during their baptism and small group leaders will participate in the immersion.

What If I Was Baptized As A Baby?

We are very glad that your parents chose to raise you in a manner that emphasizes the importance of God and spiritual things. This means that they recognize the importance of honoring God with our lives.

We too believe that God should be honored in all that we do in life. That is why we base our lives and our practices on the teachings of God's Word. The Bible is our source of authority in all that we teach and practice. As we read what the Bible teaches about baptism, the pattern is always "Believe and be baptized."

If you were baptized as a baby, you obviously were not able to believe or express faith in God on your own. Your parents were expressing their desire that you live your life in the knowledge, appreciation and love of God. They wanted you to share their belief that God loves you and takes care of you.

Baptism, in the Bible, is a sign or a symbol that a person already believes in Jesus Christ as their Leader, Forgiver, Savior, and Lord. It is a means of identifying oneself as a Christ follower and of saying that your life is committed to Jesus Christ. Baptism is also the public means of identifying with other Christ followers. Jesus Himself commanded that we should be baptized for these reasons. Of course, there is also the matter of simple obedience to Jesus, since He told (commanded) us to do it.

Your choice to be baptized as a Christ follower doesn't change/alter/ or take away anything from your infant baptism. This is a separate event in your life. This is actually the next step in the natural progression of you becoming responsible for and "owning" your personal faith in Jesus Christ. Your parents would want your faith journey to continue down the path where you choose to have a close personal faith in Jesus Christ. And now here you are!

Invite your family to join you as you choose to embrace the values of the Bible and identify with a group of Christ followers who will help you to continue down that often-times difficult path of honoring God with your life.
